#### LIVING IN THE FUTURE, NOW (Matthew 17:1-9)

INTRO: Movie: "Back to the Future"

### I. THE TRANSFIGURATION OF JESUS IS A GLIMPSE INTO GOD'S FUTURE

- A. Peter wanted to preserve the moment: The future is now! (vv. 1-4)
- B. But Peter was mistaken: The future had not fully come (v. 9)
- C. Peter learned: Knowledge of the future creates an awesome responsibility in the present (v. 6)

### II. KNOWING GOD'S FUTURE, WE HAVE A GREAT RESPONSIBILITY NOW

- A. Yet, we must confess: All we do, say, plan in the present is not shaped by God's future.
- B. God's future includes a descent into the valley, a future we cannot bear.

## III. JESUS KNEW OUR FUTURE, & THIS COMPELLED HIM TO DEEDS OF GLORY FOR US

- A. He gave up the glories of heaven, for us (Philippians 2:6-7)
- B. He showed us God's true glory at the manger (Luke 2:9-11)
- C. He let us touch God's glory as He walked our earth (John 1:14)
- D. His true work of glory was done at the cross (John 17:1ff): This is our future, now!

# IV. KNOWING OUR FUTURE, WE HAVE A GLORIOUS HOPE AND JOY

- A. We have "Christ in us, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27)
- B. Christ in us frees us to be God's glory for others in love and forgiveness

CONCL: The "One-Word Tombstone": a sign of God's future, now
