What A Surprise! (Matthew 3:13-17)

Introduction: We all enjoy a surprise...or do we?

- I. ONE DAY JOHN THE BAPTIZER REALLY GOT A SURPRISE
 - A. Jesus came to him to be baptized (verses 13-14)
 - B. What is going on here? (v. 15)
 - C. How does Jesus' baptism "fulfill all righteousness"? (v.15)
 - 1. A fulfillment of the children of Israel going through the River Jordan to the Promised Land
 - 2. A fulfillment of God's Law as the perfect sacrifice for sin
 - 3. Fully identifying with unrighteous sinners to give us God's righteousness (2 Cor.5:21)
- II. THERE'S EVEN MORE TO THIS SURPRISE OF JESUS' BAPTISM
 - A. Here are Jesus' 1st recorded words since He was 12 years old in the Temple (v.15)
 - B. These words announce the theme for all Jesus was & came to do
 - C. The surprise of Jesus' baptism declares one key truth: He came to bear & forgive the sin of the world (Isaiah 53:6)
 - 1. <u>John the baptizer said to Jesus:</u> *I need to baptized by You*
 - 2. <u>Jesus said to John:</u> It is God's plan that I am joined to all sinners in this baptism, to <u>begin</u> the work finished at the cross
 - 3. <u>John tells us why</u> Jesus' baptism is *fitting to fulfill all* righteousness (John 1:29)

Conclusion: A 'salvation surprise' on the banks of the Genesee River
