Sermon Outline - April 20, 2011 Fifth Sunday in Lent

Breath for Dry Bones (Ezekiel 37:1-14)

Introduction: That old gospel song – "Dem Bones, dem bones, dem dry bones"

- I. THE PROPHET EZEKIEL, IN A VISION, WAS IN A VALLEY OF DRY BONES (Ezekiel 37)
 - A. The vision was that of the utter destruction& hopelessness of Israel
 - B. Imagine yourself in one of the large military cemeteries with all the white crosses...
 - C. The voice of God asks "Can these bones live?" (v. 3)
- II. CAN 'DRY BONES' LIVE... CAN DEFEAT & HOPELESSNESS TURN INTO VICTORY & HOPE?
 - A. Ezekiel says "O LORD God, You Know..." (v.4)
 - B. We would say "I don't see a way, God... maybe You know a way."
 - C. In his vision, Ezekiel saw the 'dry bones' come back to life with flesh & blood
 - D. There was hope for Israel & there is hope for us...even when all seems hopeless
- III. WHAT IS GOD'S 'DRY BONES' MESSAGE TO US TODAY?
 - A. Who of us have not "stood beside the grave" of our hopes & dreams?
 - B. We cry out with Ezekiel- "Can these 'bones' live?"
 - C. Along with Ezekiel, we are realistic sometimes, humanly speaking, there is no hope.
 - D. But with Ezekiel we hope in God "O LORD God, You know..." (Matt. 19:26, Luke 1:37)
 - E. And with Ezekiel, we do what God asks & watch Him take care of all the details (vv. 5-10)
- IV. GOD INDEED PROVIDES 'BREATH FOR DRY BONES'!
 - A. He gives us 'breath", 'spirit'... "a second wind"!
 - B. In the death & resurrection of our Lord Jesus, we 'dry bones' are given new life! (Rom. 8:11)
 - C. Our God specializes in hope, in new life, in "second winds"

Conclusion: "Dem bones, dem bones, dem dry bones.... hear the Word of the LORD!"
