

The Burden of a Lesser God (Psalm 23:1)

Introduction: Who's afraid of a plastic eagle?

- I. IN PSALM 23, DAVID WARNS US AGAINST MANMADE GODS.
 - A. A god like a genie in a bottle
 - B. A god like a sweet grandpa
 - C. A god like a busy dad
 - D. Do you want a "god" that just looks nice but does nothing?
- II. DAVID TELLS US WHO GOD IS: YAHWEH – MY SHEPHERD
 - A. **L-O-R-D = Yahweh**, God's personal name (note: Exodus 3:13-14)
 - B. **Yahweh** = "I Am" **-or-** "I cause to be" ... He's no plastic, manmade god
 - C. He makes, but was never made (Psalm 90:2)
 - D. He governs, but is ungoverned (John 4:24; Psalm 139:7-8)

III. WE NEED A YAHWEH

- A. We need a L-O-R-D... we need a Shepherd
- B. We need an unchanging powerful LORD we can count on
- C. We need --- "a middle C" [consider: the tuning fork for pianos]
- D. We don't need what Dorothy discovered about *The Wizard of Oz*
- E. We don't need to carry the **burden of a lesser god!**

Conclusion:

We <u>have</u> a **Yahweh**... a L-O-R-D... a Good Shepherd (John 10:11) Who lays down His life for his sheep.
