

## WHADDIFS & HOWILLS (Psalm 23:2)

Introduction: Worry is a bag filled with "whaddifs" & "howills"...

- I. THE BIBLICAL WORD FOR WORRY: A DIVIDED MIND
  - A. Worry: "The interest due on a bill you haven't even received."
  - B. Our dear Lord Jesus speaks to us about worry (Matthew 6:27)
  - C. The story of the man who *hired someone* to worry for him  $\textcircled{\odot}$
- II. OUR LORD'S ANTIDOTE FOR WORRY: HE LEADS ME BESIDE THE STILL WATERS (Psalm 23:2)
  - A. He isn't behind you pushing & yelling; He's ahead of you gently leading
  - B. The story of the butcher & the shepherd
  - C. He leads us... Oh, HE leads us! (John 10:1-11)
- III. OUR LORD LEADS US & GIVES US WHAT WE NEED  $\underline{\rm WHEN}\ WE\ NEED\ IT$ 
  - A. His help comes when He knows the time is right (Hebrews 4:16)
  - B. The story of *the father and his children at the airport* (no "whaddifs & howills")
  - C. Your Shepherd & Saviour puts Himself between you & your need (Mark 13:11)
  - D. He will give us what is needed at the right time (Remember His provision of manna "bread from heaven" just as the people of Israel needed it Exodus 16)
  - E. He gives us the gift of facing today & entrusting tomorrow to Him (Matthew 6:34)
- IV. WHADDIFS & HOWILLS ARE NOT EVEN IN OUR LORD'S VOCABULARY
  - A. Note this especially as He was on the cross for you & me (Luke 23:33 and ff)
  - B. The scoffing *if*'s did not stop Him... the mocking *howills* did not stop Him... the doubting *if*'s did not stop Him!!
  - C. The believing thief next to Him learned this so well! (Luke 23:42-43)
  - D. David tells us the same thing: "*He leads me beside the still waters*" (Psalm 23:2)
