

THE BURDEN OF GUILT (Psalm 23:3)

Introduction: Guilty of forgetting my turn at Tuesday "Men's Breakfast"...

I. ALMIGHTY GOD IS PLANNING A HEAVENLY FEAST

- A. Sin, shame & guilt will be "checked at the door".
- B. God is not just the host of the party, He <u>is</u> the party & His goodness is the banquet.
- C. There's one BIG problem: the "price of admission" is very steep (1 John 3:7-10)

II. RIGHTEOUSNESS (BEING WITHOUT SIN) IS THE WAY ANYONE IS ADMITTED

- A. We are anything but righteous (Romans 3:10; 3:12; 3:23; 6:23)
- B. The old game "Compared to others, I think I'm righteous" does not work
- C. Almighty God points to Himself and says, "*This is what I mean by righteousness*" (1 Peter 1:1; Psalm 7:11; 112:3; Romans 2:5; Daniel 9:14; Isaiah 28:17; Romans 3:19)
- D. We are not righteous, we are guilty... guilty... guilty

III. WHAT ARE WE TO DO?

- A. Carry a heavy load of guilt? (So many do...) or --
- B. Confess our need
- C. My plea for help with men's breakfast was heard... and God hears your plea
- D. He did so much more than prepare a Tuesday breakfast

III. WHAT HAS GOD DONE?

- A. Upon the cross He made Jesus <u>unrighteous</u> that we might be made <u>righteous</u> (2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Peter 3:18; Romans 3:21-22)
- **B.** In the 23rd Psalm David said it this way: "He leads me in paths of righteousness"
- C. This path of righteousness leads up Calvary's hill to the cross.
