

## THE BURDEN OF LONELINESS (Psalm 23:4)

Introduction: The lonely woman and her water delivery...

- I. LONELINESS IS A REALITY, AND WAS FOR DAVID THE WRITER OF PSALM 23
  - A. Note also Psalm 25:16 & Psalm 35
  - B. He was "the runt of his family" & was lonely (1 Samuel 16:11)
  - C. He was later hunted by King Saul & was lonely and outcast
  - D. You have learned the truth: you don't have to be alone to feel lonely
  - E, The burden of loneliness: NOT the absence of faces, BUT the absence of intimacy
- II. COULD LONELINESS BE USED BY GOD TO GET OUR ATTENTION TO TURN TO HIM?
  - A. Urban Cowboy movie theme song: "Lookin' for Love in All the Wrong Places"
  - B. St. Augustine's 1500 year old quote: "Our heart is restless, O Lord, until it finds its rest in Thee."
  - C. An illustration: Discovering the beauty of classical music when all other "songs" are silenced.
  - D. Oh how God wants you to hear His song (Hebrews 12:6; Hosea 2:14)
- III. WHAT GOD TAUGHT DAVID, HE WOULD TEACH US AS WELL
  - A. "I will not leave you" (Genesis 28:15)
  - B. "The LORD will not abandon His people" (Psalm 94:14)
  - C. "I am with you always, even unto the ends of the earth" (Matthew 28:20)
  - D. "[LORD] You are with me..." (Psalm 23:4)
- IV. OUR LORD JESUS WAS NO STRANGER TO LONELINESS
  - A. On the cross He suffered true loneliness: separation from the Heavenly Father (Matthew 27:46)
  - B. He was forsaken so that you <u>never</u> would be
  - C. He rose from the loneliness of death & the grave for you
  - D. Knowing His love means you don't have to be desperate for love *"like a hungry shopper at the grocery store"*

Conclusion: Your Lord may use a time of solitude in your life to teach you to hear **His song...**
