

FROM PANIC TO PEACE (Psalm 23:4)

Introduction: Strange to talk about fear & problems just one week after Easter? (Not really)

I. COME WITH ME TO JUST A FEW DAYS <u>BEFORE</u> THE FIRST EASTER, IN A GARDEN

- A. We note a strange expression on Jesus' face: utter anguish (Luke 22:39-44)
- B. As true God, Jesus knew about the coming Easter glory
- C. As true man, Jesus knew that before Easter glory must come Friday suffering

II. WE WHO KNOW EASTER GLORY ALSO KNOW SUFFERING & FEAR

- A. Where do we turn in such times?
- B. We turn to the One Who was in agony in a garden (Luke 22:39-44)
- C. How loving it is of our Lord to not hide His anguish
- D. We, however, too often try to hide or disguise our fears

III. BOTH KING DAVID & OUR LORD JESUS URGE US TO TURN TO OUR FATHER IN HEAVEN

- A. So says David in Psalm 23:4 & in Psalm 56:3
- B. So says Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-44)
- C. The Father did <u>not</u> spare Jesus from the cross <u>for our sake</u> (John 3:16)
- D. He didn't take away the cross, but He took away Jesus' fear and ---
- E. Christ Jesus is risen! He is risen indeed!
- F. The risen Jesus changed His disciples' **panic to peace** as He burst through their locked doors of fear and brought his peace ("Shalom alechem")
- G. He does the same for us today

Conclusion: Today God gives us faith to join David in declaring – "[O LORD], I will fear no evil..."
