

#### SERMON OUTLINE FOR APRIL 14, 2013

### TAKING THE 'DIS' OUT OF DISAPPOINTMENT

(Psalm 23:5)

Introduction: 'Dis' changes everything... just ask Miss Haversham of Charles Dickens' novel "Great Expectations"

### I. HOW ARE YOU DOING WITH DISAPPOINTMENTS?

- A. Could God's Word have something to say to you?
- B. Yes it does... check out Psalm 23:5 "You anoint my head with oil."
- C. The shepherd's anointing oil has three purposes for his sheep
  - 1. To repel insect pests
  - 2. To prevent conflicts
  - 3. To heal wounds

## II. OUR LORD'S ANOINTING OIL IS POURED ON OUR DISAPPOINTMENTS: OUR 'WOUNDS OF THE HEART'

- A. Oh, the healing He provides (Psalm 100:3, 23:5)
- B. If the New Testament teaches us anything, it teaches us that our Lord Jesus is the Good Shepherd with healing anointing oil
  - 1. He did it for His wounded & disappointed disciples
  - 2. He did it for the empty, crooked & lonely hearted
  - 3. He did it at the cross & empty tomb
  - 4. He does the same for us today
- C. David would entrust his wounds & his heart to no one else (Psalm 23:5; 147:3)

# III. AN APPOINTMENT WITH OUR LORD TAKES THE 'DIS' OUT OF DISAPPOINTMENT

- A. In order for the sheep to have their head anointed by the shepherd's oil, they had to lower their heads & stand still before him
- B. Could the application be any clearer for us? (1 Peter 5:6-7; Luke 18:7)
- C. The sheep doesn't know exactly why or how the shepherd's oil works... all he knows is that something wonderful happens in the presence of the loving shepherd.
- D. Here's another application to us! (Psalm 25:1-2; 23:5)

Conclusion: Our Good Shepherd takes the 'Dis' out of disappointment
