Ephesians 2:1-5


INTRODUCTION: [Read with me] -

As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins in which you lived when you followed the ways of this world . . . like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath. BUT GOD, because of His great love for us, because of His great mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions – it is by grace you have been saved. (Ephesians 2:1-5)

- I. ST. PAUL PAINTS QUITE A PICTURE OF THE CONDITION OF MANKIND
 - A. He "pulls no punches"
 - B. He says we are dead
 - C. He says we are objects of God's wrath
- II. AND THEN, WITH NO WARNING, HE SPEAKS TWO WONDERFUL WORDS:
 - A. *But God* . . .
 - B. Our sin problem was a death problem
 - C. Our sin problem was a wrath problem
 - D. *But God* . . .
 - E. What a wonderful reversal!

III. MANY TODAY DO NOT EVEN USE THE WORD SIN

- B. If you speak of sin, you must speak of God
