Would You Like A Surprise?

Matthew 3:13-17

INTRODUCTION: We all enjoy a surprise . . . or do we?

I. ONE DAY JOHN THE BAPTIZER REALLY GOT A SURPRISE

- A. Jesus came to him to be baptized (verses 13-14)
- B. What is going on here? (v.15)
- C. How does Jesus' baptism "fulfill all righteousness"? (v.15)

 (He identifies fully with unrighteous sinners to give us God's righteousness & begins to take upon Himself our sins He will pay for on the cross (2 Corinthians 5:21)

II. THERE'S EVEN MORE TO THIS SURPRISE OF JESUS' BAPTISM

- A. Here are Jesus' 1st recorded words since He was 12 years old in the Temple (v.15)
- B. These words announce the theme for all Jesus was & came to do
- C. The surprise of Jesus' baptism declares one key truth: He came to bear & forgive the sin of the world (Isaiah 53:6)
 - 1. John the baptizer said to Jesus: I need to be baptized by You
 - 2. <u>Jesus said to John:</u> It is God's plan that I am joined to all sinners in this baptism, to begin the work finished at the cross
 - 3. <u>John tells us why</u> Jesus' baptism is fitting to *fulfill all righteousness* (John 1:29)
