He lives to hear my soul's complaint (Psalm 142:1-2)

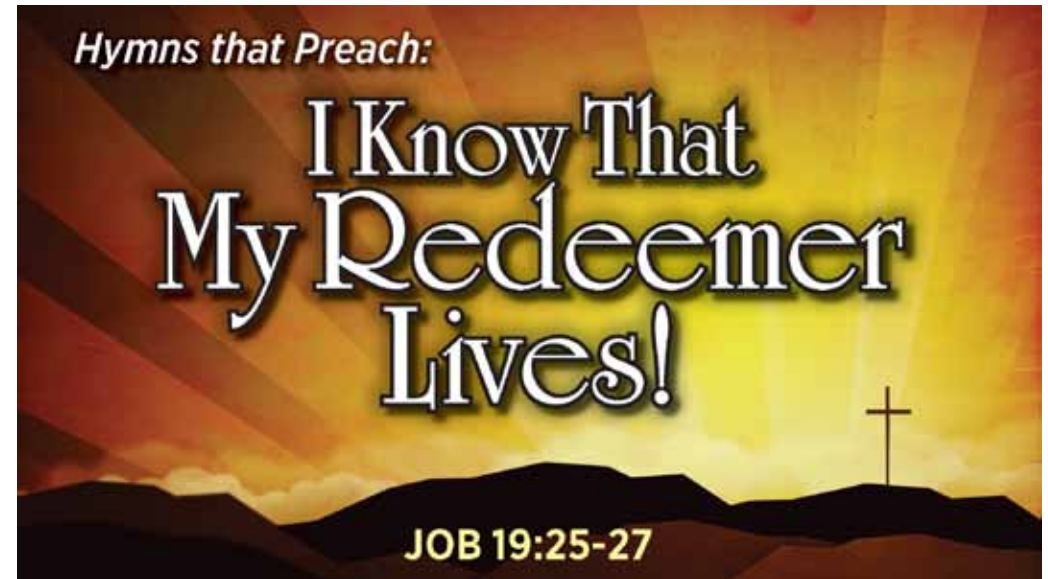
He lives to silence all my fears;
